About Us

Founded in 1897, Seattle Humane proudly promotes the human-animal bond by saving and serving pets in need. We are more than a shelter – Seattle Humane is a pet resource center for the region, providing adoption services, a pet food bank and support for pet owners, low-cost spay/neuter surgeries and wellness exams, humane education for all ages and more. All made possible through the support of a generous community.

Fast Facts

- 60K sq ft state-of-the-art facility in Bellevue, opened in 2017
- In our fiscal year 2022-2023, Seattle Humane served more than 88,000 pets and people through our many programs, and saved the lives of almost 6,000 shelter pets
- Approx. 1,100 active volunteers – equivalent to 55 full-time employees – and approx. 500 active foster parents
- The Schuler Family Medical Center is home to our veterinary care team, and serves as a teaching hospital for over 60 WSU students each year as part of their veterinary training
- The veterinary team provides nearly 17,000 exams and 5,300 spay/neuter surgeries each year for pets in need of medical care

Community Resources

Meeting the needs of the community, we have a variety of special programs to support pets and their people

- **Pet Owner Assistance Fund:** covering short term expenses and medical care
- **Pets For Life:** HSUS model expanding pet resources in underserved communities
- **Pet Food Bank:** providing nearly 82,000 meals each month to families and food banks throughout the region
- **SPOT (Supporting Pet Owners in Transition):** temporary foster care for pet owners in transition
- **Spay/Neuter & Community Medicine:** low cost spay/neuter, wellness care, microchips and vaccinations
